This is what I received from the Lord, and in turn passed on to you: that on the same night that he was betrayed, the Lord Jesus took some bread, and thanked God for it and broke it, and he said, 'This is my body, which is for you; do this as a memorial of me.' In the same way he took the cup after supper, and said, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Whenever you drink it, do this as a memorial of me.' Until the Lord comes, therefore, every time you eat this bread and drink this cup, you are proclaiming his death.

GOSPEL: Luke 9:11-17

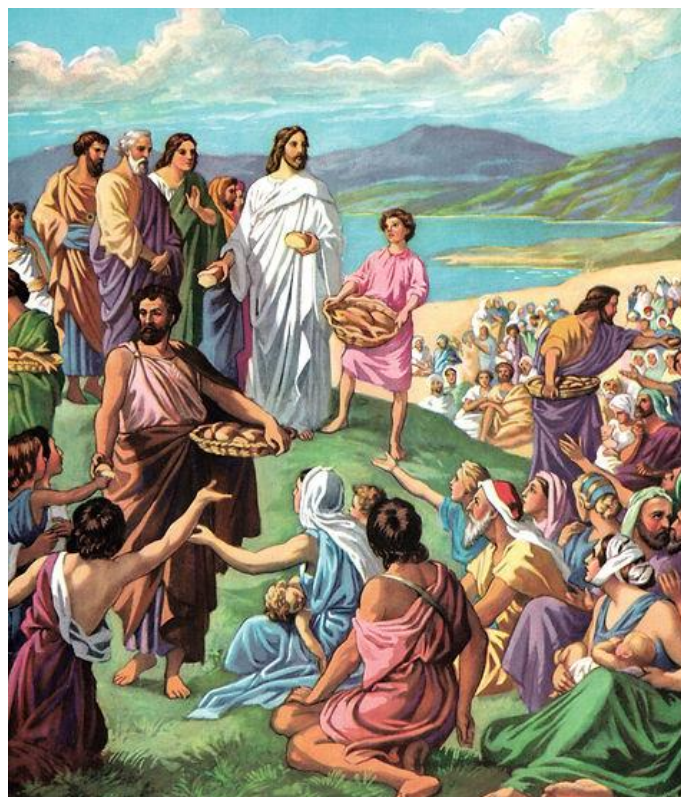
A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke They all ate and were filled.

Jesus made the crowds welcome and talked to them about the kingdom of God; and he cured those who were in need of healing.

It was late afternoon when the Twelve came to him and said, 'Send the people away, and they can go to the villages and farms round about to find lodging and food; for we are in a lonely place here.' He replied, 'Give them something to eat yourselves.' But they said, 'We have no more than five loaves and two fish, unless we are to go ourselves and buy food for all these people.' For there were about five thousand men. But he said to his disciples, 'Get them to sit down in parties of about fifty.' They did so and made them all sit down. Then he took the five loaves and the two fish, raised his eyes to heaven, and said the blessing over them; then he broke them and handed them to his disciples to distribute among the crowd. They all ate as much as they wanted, and when the scraps remaining were collected they filled twelve baskets.

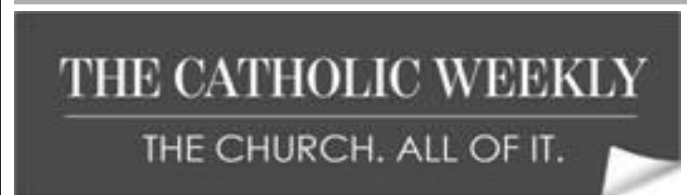

- St Mary’s Cathedral, Sydney** – relic of St Francis Xavier and the new painting of St Joseph

World Meeting of Families from Friday the 24th to the 26th June.

With the encouragement of Archbishop Anthony Fisher OP, the World Meeting of Families will be celebrated within the Archdiocese of Sydney.

In preparation for your family’s participation we suggest that during this week ahead your family will discuss, plan and prepare for the special three days of prayer and family spirituality, working out the prayers you will use on certain days and to plan the route of your Saturday pilgrimage. Beginning on **Friday the 24th June** the first celebration begins with Mass at Church and / or prayers in your home. Families are encouraged to enthrone the Sacred Heart of Jesus in their home using the prayers from the website noted above. Copies will also be available from our front foyer.

For those participating families we will sell (*for \$10*) some framed pictures of the Sacred Heart of Jesus next weekend, just in case you do not already have one in your home.

Saturday the 25th June families pilgrim together to 2 or more of the 8 parishes that have prepared for a pilgrimage. The parishes to visit are noted on the noticeboard, in the passport children are encouraged to use, on the website from above and in this bulletin. At each parish visited, children will be given a sticker for their passport.

St Therese will be one of the parishes for families to pilgrimage to, as we will have the relics of St Therese and her parents here. There will also be a catechesis here at 11am and veneration of the relics will begin at 12 midday till 6pm.

Sunday the 26th June will be centred on the Eucharist and begin with 10.30am Mass celebrated by Archbishop Fisher at St Mary’s Cathedral, after which families participate in the ‘Festival of Families’ beside the cathedral with food, coffee, music, stalls and activities for children. This celebration will conclude the three day Meeting of Families. Hope many families can participate.
